At St. Vincent we help youth facing significant life challenges through love, security and therapeutic supports that enable them to improve their lives, their families and the community.

A Message from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

I am in a blessed and enviable position. Each day we work with teens that have great smiles and a strong determination to better their lives. The challenges that they encounter are not those that many of us have faced nor even considered happening in our community...**but they do.**

We are a **safe-haven** for teens in life's storm of challenges and obstacles. Their challenges and needs are complex, thus requiring our care to be dynamic, patient and supportive. In 2015 we helped almost 400 teens and that is 45% more than in 2014. In the past 30 months the number of teens requesting our help doubled. This is a deep concern that so many continue to need so much help; however, it is why we are here...to help lives and often, to save lives.

Almost 75% of the youth we help come to us from North St. Louis County, a portion of our region that is working hard to improve education, stimulate job opportunities, and reduce crime. Those goals are necessary to turn this area into a thriving and viable community; however, today we are working with youth that are struggling with the impact of poverty, joblessness, homelessness, abuse and violence.

We have an extraordinary team that is deeply invested in the care of our youth. It is not an easy task to help teens who are often initially reluctant to receive guidance and support. However, our staff is skilled and committed to work tirelessly to help each youth and their families find a lost connection, a better way to communicate, work through their troubles and understand the need to support each other.

We want every teen to thrive! In these pages you'll read information concerning our excellent programs, the youth we have served and the differences we have made in their lives. Why we need you as a Guardian...

We have all heard the phrase, “it takes a village”...and that adage has never been truer today! When you help one of our 400 teens thrive then “our village...our community” grows and prospers. As a Guardian of Hope you can support, through one of our four giving levels, a teen through their 30-day crisis intervention stay with us and beyond.

LifeFOCUS, our 30-day crisis intervention program, provides each youth their essential needs of food, shelter, safety and 80 hours of comprehensive, life-affirming, therapy. We also provide transportation to/from each youth’s school to keep them actively engaged in their education, and aftercare therapy sessions when the youth returns home.

All of our programs are provided at no cost to our youth and their family; however, our 30-day LifeFOCUS program has a cost of \$11,000 per teen. **We are able to provide our programs at no cost** only because of your generosity and that of funders aligned with our mission.

Helping a teen today...linking them to a successful future is the opportunity that you can provide by joining us as a Guardian. For example an hour of therapy in our LifeFOCUS programs costs \$65/hour. You can provide almost 12 hours of life-changing therapy for only \$56/month.

Our Goals

Our programs are designed to improve all aspects of a youth's life by focusing on the root causes of their emotional or behavioral problems. The goals of treatment include:

- Increasing self-image.
- Improving problem solving skills.
- Understanding personal issues.
- Improving communication with family and peers.
- Dealing with anger appropriately.
- Stopping self-destructive behaviors.
- Increasing compliance with rules.
- Taking steps toward emancipation.
- Making positive choices, and accepting feedback.

Programs

LifeFOCUS: Residential and In-Home Support

This 30-day, residential treatment program and aftercare program serves youth between the ages of 10 and 19 who have severe behavioral and/or emotional challenges that require intensive remediation. Our goal for treatment is to show a reduction in behavioral and emotional symptoms and enhanced family relationships.

LifeRECOVER: Helping Teens Overcome Substance Abuse

For youth between the ages of 10 and 19, suffering from drug and/or alcohol abuse and addiction, we offer an outpatient substance abuse treatment service that supports teens in becoming clean and sober and maintaining ongoing recovery.

LifePATHS: Helping Homeless Teens Take Steps Toward Adulthood

This program is for teens between the ages of 16 and 19, who are emancipated or homeless and need assistance creating a path that leads to successful adulthood. We offer brief-stay, temporary shelter, and therapy to fulfill education requirements, financial knowledge and improve job prospects.

InHomeFOCUS: Support for Personal Family Challenges

For youth between the ages 8 and 19, this program offers four to six months of weekly therapy designed to address not only the child's personal challenges but also the difficulties that can arise from conflicts amongst family members.

What shaped your beliefs of helping others? Is there a story to tell?

The motto, “it takes a village to raise a child”, was instilled in me at an early age by my mother. She ensured that I was surrounded by people who fostered my need to grow and to excel not only in the classroom but as a member of a community.

As a youth growing up in Berkeley, Missouri, I was a member of the Berkeley Youth Council. As a member I had the opportunity to learn from community leaders, my peers and my neighbors. I understood early in life that you have to plant seeds and foster growth in others for them to one day be able to be contributing members of society. That is what I hope for each day when I walk through the doors of St. Vincent. As the Clinical Director it is my duty to create a therapeutic environment where our youth are treated holistically as individuals and have life-changing experiences.

Have you always been pulled to helping youth? If so, why?

Yes, my first real job was working as a youth care worker in a long-term residential facility in Georgia. As a young adult I learned that I had the passion and drive to make a difference. With a heart of compassion and love for all people, I have had the opportunity to serve individuals of all ages starting at birth at a childcare center to the elderly with dementia at a psychiatric hospital.

What do you feel the biggest needs are of the youth in our region? And how does St. Vincent address those needs?

Youth need someone such as their families, teachers, mentors or someone who truly cares to be advocates for them, to push them, guide them and travel through this journey of life with them. They need guidance and exposure to build their self-esteem, empowering them to achieve goals beyond their beliefs. Lastly each youth in our care needs the resources and tools to support them to reach their goals.

At St. Vincent’s we have built and foster a social learning environment where our youth learn skills to use in their daily lives.

What are your three objectives for St. Vincent?

- To create a therapeutic environment where all youth feel safe and are cared and supported by skilled professionals.
- To cultivate minds, and foster growth in youth by offering life-changing opportunities.
- To provide families with the resources and skills needed to enhance their families’ quality of life.

Dr. Graves’ Background

Dr. Graves has also worked with homeless Veterans at the Salvation Army, Early Childhood families at Saint Martin’s Child Center, and individuals battling Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse disorders in Atlanta.

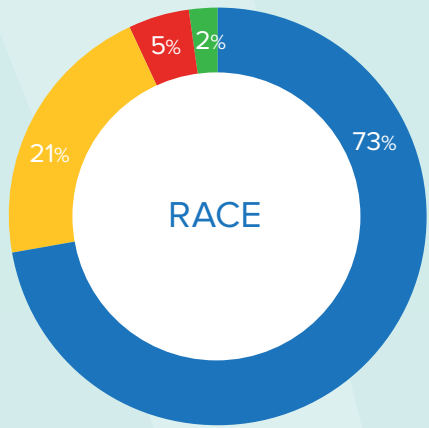

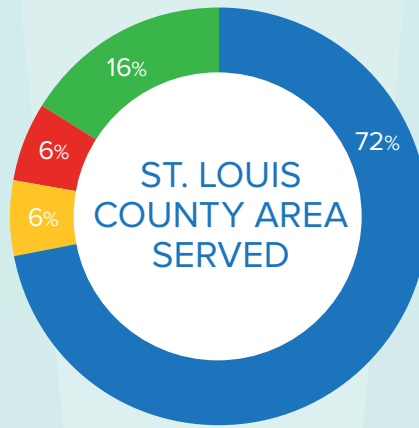

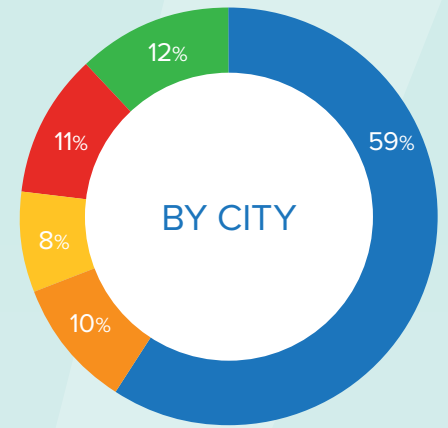
Who We Served in 2015

- OTHER (ASIAN, HISPANIC)



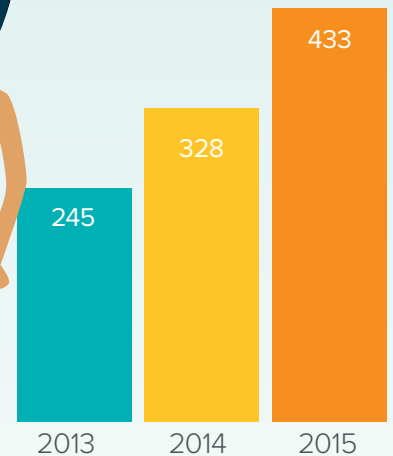
